## Subject: English

The relation in which a Noun or Pronoun stands to some other word is called its case. There are three Cases:

1. **Nominative Case:** When a Noun or Pronoun is used as a Subject of a Verb, it is said to be in the Nominative Case. For example:

1. Shekhar has written a book.
2. We sang a song.
3. The stone fell from above.

The Nominative Case in a sentence can be found by asking the question 'Who' or 'What' to the verb.

2. **Objective or Accusative Case:** When a Noun or Pronoun is used as the object of a Verb, it is said to be in the Objective Case. For example:

1. He tore a book.
2. Ramesh learnt his lesson.
3. She beats the dog with a stick.

Objective Case can be found out by putting the question 'Whom' or 'What' after the verb.

3. **Possessive or Genitive Case:** A noun is said to be in the Possessive Case when it shows the possession on anything. It is shown either by the use of an *apostrophe* and *s* or by the preposition *of*. For example:

1. Deepa's mother is a gentle lady.
2. We saw the rows of soldiers' tents.
3. The door of the house is closed.

To find the Possessive Case, put the question, 'Whose?'

## 66. Commonwealth Games

After Olympics, Commonwealth Games is the second largest sports festival in the world. The Games are held once in four years but only in between the Olympic years. The Games were originally known as the British Empire Games.

- The 1st Commonwealth Games were held in 1930 at Hamilton, Canada.
- The 10th Commonwealth Games were held at Christchurch, New Zealand in 1974 and the 15th in Victoria (*Canada*) in 1994, where about 3,350 athletes from 64 nations (*including South Africa, which joined the family of Commonwealth athletes after 36 years*) participated.
- Namibia also, which gained its independence in 1990, made its debut while Hong Kong made its final appearance in the Games before being ceded to China in 1997.
- India, for the first time, participated in the second Commonwealth games held in London in 1934.

## XXI Commonwealth Games : Gold Coast 2018

- The 2018 Commonwealth Games held at Gold Coast City, in the south-east of the Australian state of Queensland from 4 – 15 April 2018.
- On 4 April 2018, over 4,600 athletes and 2,000 team officials from 71 nations and territories converged on the Gold Coast for an 11 day sporting and cultural event.
- This is the 5th time that Australia has hosted the Games, the others being – 1938 Sydney, 1962 Perth, 1982 Brisbane and 2006 Melbourne.
