2 Aerodynamic Mishap



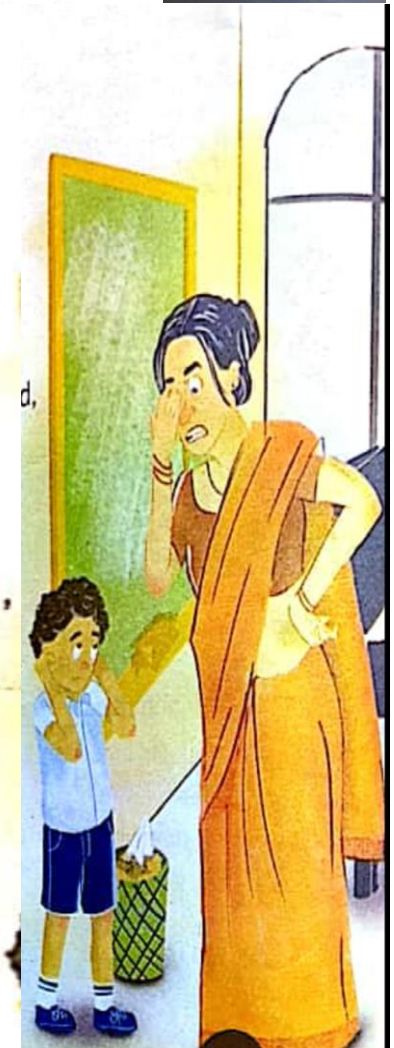
I made a paper aeroplane,

Ans- The femur (thigh bone) is longest bone of the body.

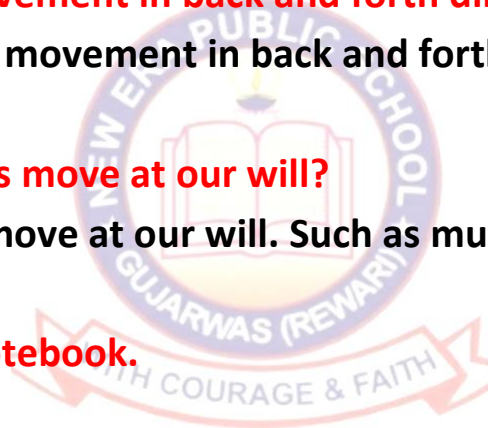
Q4 Which joint allow movement in back and forth direction?

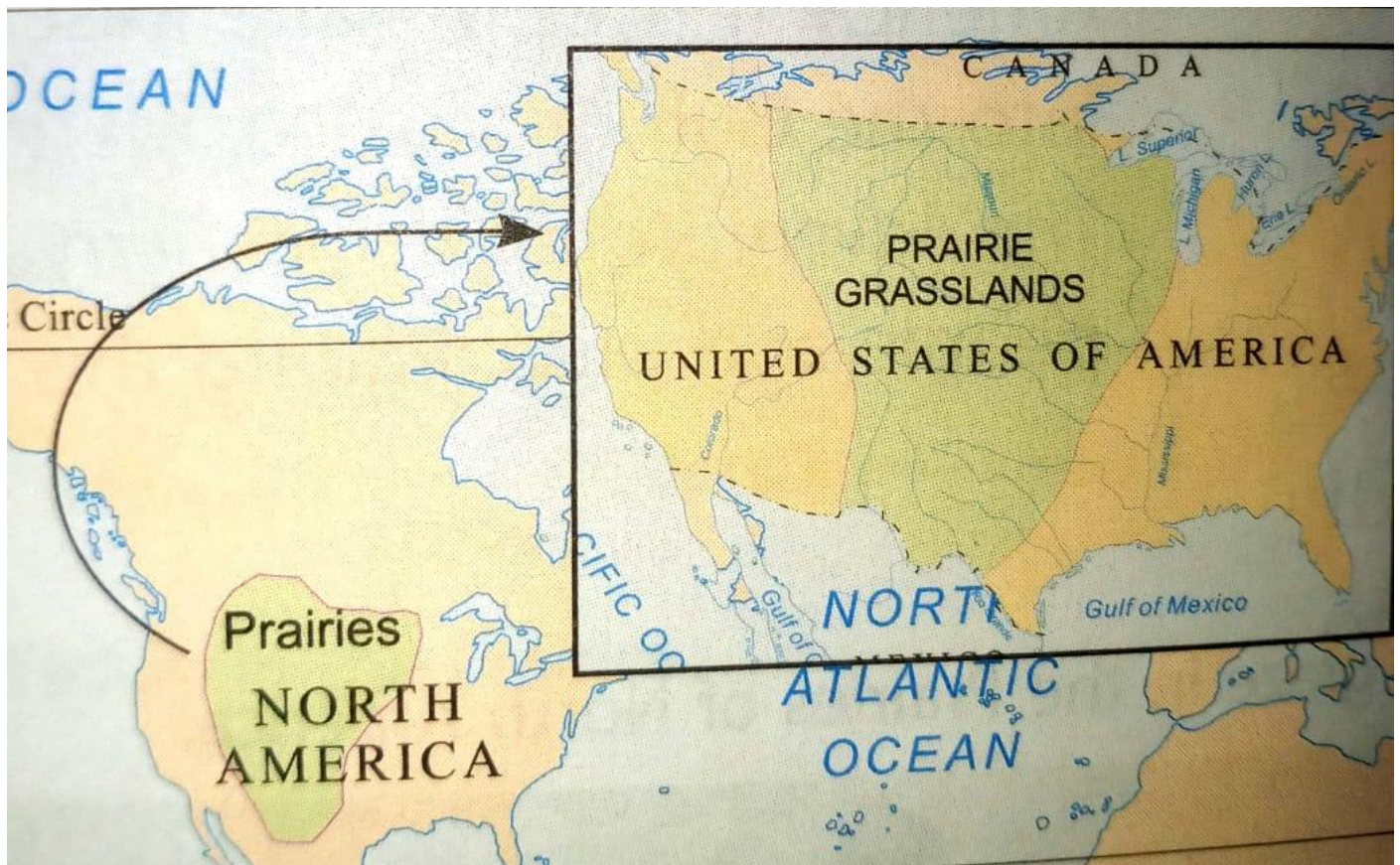

Q. 2 What is another name for 'Prairies'?

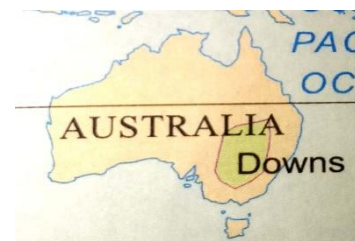
Ans. Another name of the 'Prairies' is "sea of grass".

Ans. Prairies is the major grassland of the North America.

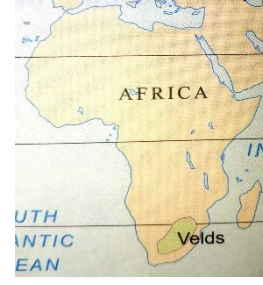

To Find the LCM by Prime Factorisation Method.

Step 1 Find the prime factor of the given numbers.

Step 2 The L C M of given numbers is the product of all different prime factors, taking the common prime factors occurring maximum number of times.

For example Find the L C M of 48 and 72 by prime Factorisation method.

Solution: Resolving each of the given numbers into prime factors, we get:

2 48	2 72
2 24	2 36
2 12	2 18
2 6	3 9
3 3	3 3
1	1

$$48 = 2 \times 2 \times 2 \times 2 \times 3$$

$$72 = 2 \times 2 \times 2 \times 3 \times 3$$



Here, 2 appears maximum 4 times in one of the prime Factorisations;

3 appears maximum 2 times in one of the prime Factorisations;

Now, we take 2 four times and 3 two times and multiply to get the L C M.

So, LC M of 48 and 72 = $2 \times 2 \times 2 \times 2 \times 3 \times 3 = 144$
