## Class: 5<sup>th</sup> Subject: Maths

Find an equivalent fraction of  $\frac{5}{9}$  with denominator 45

Solution Let  $\frac{5}{9} = \frac{\text{-----}}{45}$

Then, we have to find the missing numeral. We get 45 in the denominator, we multiply

9 by 5. So, we multiply the numerator also by 5.

$$\frac{5}{9} = \frac{5 \times 5}{9 \times 5} = \frac{25}{45}$$

Hence,  $\frac{5}{9}$  and  $\frac{25}{45}$  are equivalent fractions.

To test whether Two Given Fractions are Equivalent or Not.

Two fractions are equivalent, if

(Numerator of first  $\times$  Denominator of second) = (Denominator of first  $\times$  Numerator of second)

For example: Check whether  $3/7$  and  $9/21$  are equivalent fractions.

Solution Cross multiply as shown  $3/7$  and  $9/21$

We have:  $3 \times 21 = 63$  and  $7 \times 9 = 63$

Thus, the two cross products are equal


Hence,  $3/7$  and  $9/21$  are equivalent fractions.
