As you can see, picture A has **one** of everything—one chair, one book, one toy, one mat, one shelf, one curtain, and one clock.

Picture B has **two** of everything—two chairs, two books, two toys, two mats, two shelves, two curtains, and two clocks.

Chair, book, toy, mat, shelf, curtain, and clock are **singular nouns**.

Chairs, books, toys, mats, shelves, curtains, and clocks are **plural nouns**.

A noun that refers to one person, place, animal, or thing is called a **singular noun**.

A noun that refers to more than one person, place, animal, or thing is called a **plural noun**.

Here are some rules to change singular nouns to plural nouns.

Rules	Examples
add -s	• desk—desks • chair—chairs
add -es to nouns ending in -s, -z, -x, -sh, -ch	• walrus—walruses • brush—brushes
add -s to nouns ending in a vowel + y	• key—keys • toy—toys
add -es to nouns ending in a consonant + y after changing y to i	• lady—ladies • body—bodies
add -es to nouns ending in o	• potato—potatoes 
add -es to nouns ending in -f or -fe after changing f/fe to v	• scarf—scarves • wife—wives
add -s to nouns ending in vowel + f	• roof—roofs

There are some nouns which do not follow these rules to change into the plural form. These nouns **change completely** in the plural form. For example—

- man—men
- goose—geese
- child—children



Countable and uncountable nouns

We can count these nouns in singular and plural forms. Such nouns are called **countable nouns**.

Now look at these words.

- milk
- honey

We do not say 'one milk', 'three milks', 'one honey', or 'two honeys'. These nouns cannot be counted. Such nouns are called **uncountable nouns**. They do not have a plural form.


Different ways of eating

Different animals eat in different ways. The feeding habit of animals depend on the the **teeth**, **shape of mouth** and **jaw** of the animals and the **kind of food** they eat.




Gnawing- Animals like squirrel, rat and rabbit have sharp front teeth both in upper and lower jaw to cut the nuts, seeds or fruits. They keep biting or nibbling the food with their sharp teeth this way of eating is called **gnawing**.

Chewing the cud- Animals like cow, buffalo and goat graze the grass. They swallow the food without chewing it. After sometime they bring this food back into their mouth and keep chewing it for hours. This is called **chewing the cud**. Such animals are called **ruminants**.



Sucking- Some insects like mosquitoes, butterflies and honey-bees suck their food. These insects have **long, pointed sucking tubes**.

Swallowing - Animals like snake do not chew their food. They swallow the whole animal.
